Andrew Kelsey enslaved, starved, beat, raped and murdered the Xalanapo people. In the winter of 1849, Kelsey decided that he would march all of the elders and the children to Sacramento. And he forced them to make the ropes that he planned to use to bind them together for the march. Naming the town after this man is offensive and derogatory.

The town of Kelseyville is the gateway to Mount Konocti. The name Konocti was given to the mountain by the people of the Elem Colony thousands of years ago. Elders from all seven Lake County tribes have approved the use of the name Konocti for the town.

The place deserves a name that honors the people who have lived on this land for untold generations. Adopting the name Konocti would be a gift to these people whose ancestors suffered greatly from the heinous actions of Andrew Kelsey.

We urge the US Board on Geographic Names approve this proposal.
